






## Canute's Voyage With His Father




"Which day of the week do you like best? Here you can draw some of the things that happen, or that you like to do, during your favorite day."

### **Start A Diary**

A diary is a special book of your own. In this book, you can write or draw what you did on each day. Later, you might look at this book to remember the fun things you did. What did you do on Sun's Day, Moon's Day, Tiu's Day, Woden's Day, Thor's Day, Frigg's Day, Saturn's Day? Ask an adult to help you create this special book, and here's how: You can remove the page to the right by cutting along the dotted line. Then cut out the symbols for each day.

In a wirebound (or spiral) notebook, divide the pages into seven sections. On the first page, write the words "My Diary." At the top of the next page, glue or tape the symbol for Sunday. Then, at the beginning of the next section, glue or tape the symbol for Monday. Continue this process throughout the book.

To use this special book, turn to the section that is the same as today. Write today's actual date. Now draw pictures or ask an adult to help you write the words in order to describe what you did today. You can use this diary for many weeks by repeating this process.
